

The Pegasus 'Peggy Poo Punt'



Terms and conditions

The 'Peggy Poo Punt' is a fun way to raise funds for Pegasus, with a large prize for the winner! Please enter the competition with a joyous spirit, and respect the final decision of the adjudicator/judge. Thank you and good luck!

Here are the important details:

- To enter the competition and 'own' a square in the *Peggy Poo Punt*, purchase your individually numbered raffle ticket from Pegasus staff, volunteers or from the Pegasus front office.
- Tickets are \$25 each – no exceptions; and there are only 200 tickets available. Once sold out, no additional tickets will be available.
- Sales close at 12.30pm on Saturday, 5 May 2018. The prize winner will be identified at the Pegasus Open Day on Saturday, 5 May at 1.15pm.
- Any unsold tickets/squares at the close of ticket sales (12.30pm on Saturday, 5 May) will be assigned to the ownership of Pegasus.

There will be 1 prize only!

The prize winner will receive \$2,500 cash!

How it all works:

- At 1.15pm on Open Day, two horses will be let into a gridded and numbered paddock (poo grid).
- The poo grid will be numbered randomly by the official *poo-judicator* (Pegasus poo grid adjudicator/judge).
- The prize winner will be determined by the first poo plop landing on a square in the poo grid:
 - Poo plops that land on a grid line are deemed ineligible. (i.e. the first plop that lands in an actual grid square will be deemed the winner).
 - If the horses poo at the same time with both poo plops hitting the ground at the same time, then the plop that came from the horse wearing the red ribbon on its halter will be deemed the winning poo.
 - If the horses poo more than once, the first poo plop that falls will determine the winner.
 - If the horses are taking a long time to poo, Pegasus reserves the right to add additional horses to the paddock to speed up the process.
- The independent poo grid adjudicator/judge will make the decision and the judge's decision is final.
- The poo grid paddock is out-of-bounds to competitors. Anyone who enters the poo grid paddock will be ineligible to claim the prize.
- Anyone who attempts to interfere with the competition once the horse has been released onto the grid (e.g. scare, startle, touch, restrain, feed or coax the horse) will be disqualified from the competition.
